Design Your Perfect Park

Frederick Law Olmsted designed some of our nation's best-known and most-loved parks and green spaces. Imagine your own perfect park: What would you put in your dream park? What are the most important things a park needs to be enjoyed by everyone? Sketch it out!



Park in a Box

Make your own mini park in a box! All you need is a shoebox, paper, glue, paints, paintbrushes, Scotch tape and any other material you might use to bring your park to life.
